



## E Arrival Card of India

---

India has introduced a new e-card system for foreign travelers arriving in the country, designed to streamline the immigration process, enhance security, and improve the overall travel experience. Here's an overview of what such a system might entail, based on ongoing trends in digital immigration management:

### How It Works:

**Pre-Arrival:** Travelers fill out the necessary details on a government website or app prior to their trip, and their application is approved. Upon approval, the e-card (containing biometric data, passport number, visa details, and travel information) is generated and sent to the traveler's mobile or email.

**Arrival in India:** At the airport, travelers scan the e-card using kiosks or biometric gates. The system quickly verifies the traveler's information, allowing them to pass through immigration with minimal delay.

**Post-Arrival:** The e-card might be linked to other services like booking a taxi, hotel check-in, and more, ensuring a seamless travel experience. If necessary, travelers can access government services, extend visas, or file travel-related requests through the same system.

**E arrival card is totally free, there are not charges**

### Who needs to use it / Who is exempt

- All foreign nationals entering India (tourists, business travellers, students, medical visitors, researchers, etc.) must use the e-Arrival Card.



- Exemptions: Indian citizens, Overseas Citizens of India (OCIs) are not required to fill this.

### **When you must do it**

- The e-Arrival Card must be filled out up to 72 hours (3 days) before arrival in India.
- There is a transition period (lasting ~ six months) during which physical (paper) cards may still be accepted, but travellers are strongly encouraged to use the digital card to speed up processing.

### **Where / How to fill it out**

You can submit the e-Arrival Card through any one of:

- Official Indian Visa Online website – in the “e-Arrival” section.
- “Su-Swagatam” mobile app.
- Participating airport websites – for example, the Delhi airport site.

Once you submit, you will receive a digital confirmation (could be a reference number, QR code, etc.). You should carry that (either on your phone or printed) when you travel.

### **What to do on arrival**

- At immigration, officers will refer to your submitted e-Arrival information. Since you filled it out ahead of time, the process should be faster. No need to fill paper forms.
- Carry your passport, visa (or e-visa), and the e-Arrival Card confirmation. The passport / visa checks are still needed. The e-Arrival is in addition to your visa; it does not replace visa requirements.

### **Things to watch out for:**

- Make sure you fill out the form before you travel (within the allowed window, i.e. up to 3 days prior). If not, there could be delays.



- Ensure accuracy: mistakes in passport number, address, or arrival date could cause issues at immigration.
- Keep the digital confirmation safe and accessible (e.g. on phone and/or printed).
- During the transition period (first ~6 months), some airports might still accept paper cards, but using the e-Arrival Card is recommended.
